Justice Upheld in PCPNDT Case



- A Nashik-based radiologist and his doctor wife faced a complaint under the “Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques Act (PCPNDT Act)”
- Allegations led to legal proceedings, questioning the couple’s practice ethics.





The Bombay High Court reviewed the case thoroughly.

The court highlighted “Misuse of Power” by authorities involved.

It noted an alarming trend of targeting medical practitioners without substantial evidence.





- The High Court dismissed the complaint.
- It expressed “**Displeasure at the harassment of doctors**” setting a crucial precedent for fair implementation of law.





- The verdict emphasizes that laws like PCPNDT must be enforced with “**Caution and fairness**”.
- Authorities must avoid punitive measures based on mere technicalities.





- The case reinforces the need to protect doctors from undue harassment.
- Encourages medical practitioners to stay informed about their legal rights and the importance of customized Indemnity to protect themselves from uncertainties.





This case serves as a reminder to uphold justice while fostering trust between the medical community and authorities.
